

UNIFORM GUIDELINES YEARS 7 - 10

It is compulsory for all secondary school students at Central Coast Steiner School to wear our school uniform. We believe a student best demonstrates their individuality through their deeds and creations, rather than through their purchasing of manufactured and branded garments.

It is also important that students are sun-safe and protected for the various lesson activities they will encounter, and the CCSS school uniform provides this protection. Uniform items are to be purchased or ordered through the school office. Shoes, socks, hats and sport shorts will need to be purchased separately.

Uniform Year 7-10

All parts of the school uniform should be worn at school and to and from school. The uniform should be the correct length and be clean and tidy.

Skirts, Trousers and Shorts:

- School-issued navy skirt, navy shorts, long navy pants or tracksuit pants. Hem lengths for skirts and shorts should be at least mid-thigh length.
- Navy stockings or full-leg tights can be worn underneath skirts or shorts for extra warmth in winter.
- The sports shorts are for sport only.

Shoes:

- Black, lace-up leather or suede shoes. Shoes must cover full instep only. No soft uppers (canvas or fabric) are allowed for safety reasons. Vans and Converse will be accepted if they are FULL BLACK LEATHER (soles must be black).

Shirts and Tops:

- White blouse or white shirt (short sleeve) with embroidered school logo and trim.
- Polo shirt with embroidered school logo – choice of colours. Long-sleeve undershirts may be worn underneath polo shirts for extra warmth – all colours accepted, but without branding.
- Thermals may be worn underneath shirts for extra warmth – all colours accepted, but without branding.
- Navy pullover, cardigan or jacket with embroidered school logo and trim.

Hats, Scarfs and Jackets:

- CCSS hats embroidered with the school logo are encouraged.
- Broad-brimmed or legionnaire hats provide the best sun protection and are encouraged.
- Caps without excessive logos or branding are also acceptable.
- Beanies are optional for winter months only.
- Navy or black scarf or navy gloves may be worn for extra warmth.
- Navy or black waterproof rain jacket for outdoor use.

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Sport:

- School-issued tracksuit pants.
- School-issued blue sports polo shirt.
- School-issued navy-blue sports shorts.
- Black or navy-blue tights or 'skins' may be worn underneath sports shorts. Tights or 'skins' ARE NOT a substitute for shorts.
- Lace-up runners or joggers with supportive cushioned sole (no studs)
- The sports uniform may only be worn on the day students have school sports.
- If students are participating in sport after 3 pm, they should change into their sports attire after school.
- PASS elective students should wear their school uniform and change into their sports uniform before class

Dress Code Years 7-10:

- The school uniform or sports uniform must be worn, as set out in the Uniform Advice.
- Tattoos are not permitted.
- There is a limit of 2 earrings per ear.
- Ear stretchers are not permitted.
- A single sterling silver nose stud is permitted, however, this should be purchased from the school uniform shop. Jewellery should not be excessive and needs to be removed for sport, PDHPE and other physical activities.
- Make-up should be subtle. Excessive make-up is not permitted.
- Hair colour is the student's choice.
- No false nails.
- Uniform should be purchased from our school shop.

Consequences for disrespect of the Dress Code:

- Community Service may be given and/or a note may be sent home if a child is dressed inappropriately.
- Make-up may be removed by the student at the office and a note sent home.
- For repeated breaches or inappropriate clothing, the parents/guardians will be advised.
- Students may be requested to change their clothing if inappropriate and may be provided with alternative clothing if necessary.

If unforeseen emergencies prevent a student from wearing any part of the school uniform, it is requested that parents provide their child with a note or an email to the office explaining the reason for being out of uniform. Alternative items worn should be of a similar design and colour to the required school uniform. We will endeavour to provide students with spare items for the day and we ask it is returned washed and dried, as soon as possible.
